### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### NEW COACH - NEW ERA FOR TAS SWIMMING

The first meet of the season was at the Gordonvale pool, I'm sure it was an eye opener for our new coach after relocating from the Gold Coast; we had 11 TAS swimmers compete. We finished the 2022-2023 season with 30 swimmers entered into the FNQ Championships, there were some swimmers not eligible due to age, school commitments or having no qualifying times.

As always, our results in the pool speak for themselves with 11 swimmers qualifying to compete at the Queensland State Titles, 7 qualifying for Nationals and 1 qualifying to compete for a spot on the Australia team at the World Championship Trials.

#### "All in all, a successful year for our swimmers."

There have been a few changes behind the scenes for our club. We purchased some equipment for the strength and conditioning program of our Performance Squad as well as engaged specialists in physiotherapy and nutrition to assist our swimmers and families.

Our 22-year-old electronic timing system and scoreboard have finally ceased working reliably. We are indebted to our life member Adrian Simpson for keeping everything going for the last seven years but it is now time to upgrade to remain the best facility for swimming in FNQ. We have been successful in obtaining a grant to replace our scoreboard; however, the 20-week shipping time will mean it won't be here for this season, but it will be up and running for next year. We do still need to raise funds to assist with the replacement of the electronic timing system, TAS School has donated the computers required for this system and we thank them very much for their generosity.

A big thank you goes to everyone involved in TAS Swimming. As they say, 'it takes a village to raise a child' well it definitely takes a club to raise a swimmer.

As always, it has been a pleasure to be a member of TAS Swimming for 2022-2023.

# COACH'S REPORT

#### WHAT A YEAR IT HAS BEEN

The very first carnival was at Gordonvale, in a little 25m pool where TAS was represented by only 11 swimmers. The beginning of a great season!

We competed at FNQ Short Course champs with 20 swimmers and finished 4<sup>th</sup> overall in the Region. In August, TAS Swimming competed at the Queensland Short Course Championships in Brisbane, 3 swimmers from TAS raced alongside the best swimmers of the State.

- Albert An won 4 Gold (400m IM, 50m,100m & 200m Breaststroke), 1 Silver (200m IM), 2 Bronze (200m Butterfly and 100m IM);
- Leah Snelling won 1 Silver (200m Freestyle), 1 Bronze (100m Freestyle) and
- Tara Olds placed 14<sup>th</sup> in the 100m Backstroke.

Due to his outstanding performances during the Queensland Short Course Championships, Albert and I were selected for the QLD TRI Meet on the Gold Coast at the end of September. What a great experience for Albert to be part of the Queensland Team along with the best 71 swimmers of the state.

During the Queensland Open Water Championship on the Sunshine Coast, Cara Elliott competed in the 5 km race, she placed 9<sup>th</sup> in her age group and qualified for the Australian Open Water Championship in Western Australia where she finished 25<sup>th</sup>.

The club performed well at regional meets in preparation for the December State Championships in Brisbane.



In December, TAS Swimming was well represented with 10 swimmers at the Queensland Swimming Championships. Most of our swimmers produced personal best times with a core of swimmers making finals.

- Aisling Rothwell 10<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke;
- Amber Robinson 9<sup>th</sup> 50m Backstroke;
- Rayner Ganfield 8<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 10<sup>th</sup> 100m Backstroke;
- Albert An 3<sup>rd</sup> 5m0 Breaststroke, 6<sup>th</sup> 100m Breaststroke, 4<sup>th</sup> 200m Breaststroke, 8<sup>th</sup> 200 Butterfly, 5<sup>th</sup> 200m Individual Medley, 4<sup>th</sup> 400m Individual Medley

At the 2023 FNQ Championships during the first weekend of March, 30 TAS swimmers competed with great results. The club finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the overall points score.

During the Australian Age Championship on the Gold Coast, TAS was represented by 7 swimmers. Most swimmers produced personal best times with a core of swimmers making finals:

- Rayner Ganfield 16<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle,
- Ryan Elliott 14<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 7<sup>th</sup> 100m Breaststroke;
- Albert An not only made final in all his events but he also won two Gold medals in the 50m and 100 m Breaststroke.


In June, Albert will compete at the World Championship Trials in Melbourne.
